




## Family Health Center Visits



### Total AR Cash Receipts Compared to Prior Twelve Months




## Total Patient Revenues






## Net Patient Revenues


















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# Yield Curve





#### Total – Adults and NICU







# Average Daily Census





# Total Outpatient Occasions of Service










# Total AR Cash Receipts





# Total Net Patient Revenues





In 2020, the laboratory entered into an agreement with Grifols Diagnostic Solutions, Inc. under a TPC and Vizient contract for blood bank analyzers. Our contract is a reagent rental agreement that was set to expire on 10/25/2025. We are requesting to extend this contract for 1 year. Extension will require the committed purchase of \$150,258.94 worth of reagents and consumables for the analyzers and \$28,956.44 for the required service contracts on the analyzers and manual station. These analyzers are used in the Blood Bank to perform blood typing and antibody screening for patients that are scheduled to receive blood and blood products. It is the blood bank's plan to purchase new analyzers from a different vendor; however, the capital purchase is currently on hold. Due to the capital purchase pause, it is necessary to extend the current contract with Grifols until such time as we can purchase, install, and validate new analyzers. The service contracts are required because MCH does not own the analyzers and therefore Trimedx is not authorized to provide service for these analyzers.

**Objective:** 

As part of our annual Microsoft licensing renewal, we conducted a comprehensive self-audit of our IT environment to ensure full compliance with Microsoft's licensing requirements. This proactive True-Up review revealed several areas where our license counts needed to be adjusted to reflect actual usage. These adjustments have resulted in a significant increase in our True-Up costs.

We added System Center Standard licenses across our entire Windows Server environment to ensure full coverage. To optimize future costs, we transitioned this licensing into the CIS Suite under the Server and Cloud Enrollment (SCE) program, which offers discounted pricing over a three-year term.

Our audit revealed that our Windows Server license counts were below actual deployment due to a change in the way that Microsoft issues licenses. They are no longer per server licenses and are now calculated on a per core per server calculation. We corrected these counts to align with our infrastructure, ensuring we remain compliant.

These changes were necessary to bring our licensing into full compliance and avoid any potential audit or settlement actions from Microsoft. While the cost increase is substantial, it reflects our commitment to transparency, accuracy, and long-term cost optimization.

Our current three-year Microsoft Enterprise Agreement is set to expire at the end of November. We are actively reviewing and negotiating a new three-year agreement. As of now, the projected cost for the renewal is \$2,110,883.03 over the next three years. However, negotiations are still ongoing, and we are also comparing pricing with other vendors to ensure we secure the most cost-effective and strategic solution for the organization.

At this time, the True-Up cost outlined is required under our current contract. Any changes resulting from ongoing negotiations will be communicated separately.
