The Ace Foundation, the charitable arm of Ace Hardware, granted \$42,425 through their Helping Hand Fund to Children's Miracle Network at Medical Center Health System for the purchase of 15 Angel Eye Cameras for the NICU. These multiuse cameras allow care teams to share patient status updates and memorable moments with real-time texts, pictures, and recorded videos. The portal will let MCH share essential education and monitor parents' progress on their infant's path to discharge, and can translate in different languages to better improve communication.



May is for Miracles is an awareness and fundraising campaign for Children's Miracle Network at Medical Center Health System. The campaign included Jeans Day every day for the month, a t-shirt design contest involving MCHS employees, internal fundraising, and community events with CMN partners. Special videos were also shared across social media that featured Pediatric and NICU staff, as well as miracle stories from CMN families. With the support of the community and MCHS employees, CMN raised more than \$1,500 to help children in the Samantha Canady Center for Pediatric Care and newborns in the NICU.



Every year, Children's Miracle Network at Medical Center Health System partners with radio stations across the Permian Basin to raise funds for CMN. During these multi-day events, our radio partners present miracle stories featuring children from the area and talk about how families in the region benefit from community support through donations to CMN. Money raised through the radiothons help CMN purchase medical equipment and fund programs and supplies for children's services.

Every year, more than 23,000 children receive care from Medical Center Health System. Medical Center Health System (MCHS) volunteers are an integral part of our healthcare team and are often the ambassadors on the frontlines of the patient experience and serving our community.

Due to COVID-19, our MCHS volunteers were forced to stop providing their services due to CDC Guidelines and safety precautions; however, their presence was missed among the patients and hospital employees. Once MCHS was able to bring back our volunteers, they were willing and ready to help serve and greet, once again!

Not only were our volunteers ready to serve but our junior volunteers were ready to hit the frontlines as well and serve in any capacity they could. Our Junior Volunteer Teen Leadership Program is a year-round program that provides teens many opportunities to experience the world of healthcare in a professional environment. Employees, physicians, and volunteers from every department play a key role in the program.

Dhruv P., served as a Junior Volunteer and served in the Emergency Room Department. Dhruv provided a statement of his experience:



"I worked in the ER Area on June 10th, 2021. Overall, the staff treated me pretty nice, and they were pretty much surprised when they saw a Junior Volunteer working after a while. They were interactive with me and talked to me. I was out to answer the phone calls, which turned out to be very important, especially in an emergency area. While I waited for phones, I was also asked to help set up equipment; for example, tie certain small tubes together and bag bottles which are used in their procedures. I did get to observe how the nurses respond when a patient would be brought in an emergency, and they would bring blankets, do their procedure to start putting liquids in a patient, and how they handled that patient. I also saw them responding to calls from the paramedics bringing incoming patients, which was pretty cool. I would recommend this to other JVs because it would give them the experience of being on the frontline and seeing the behind the scenes of what goes on after you see an ambulance rushing through the streets. Most likely, when I get back from tennis, I'll sign up to go back!"

Year in Review Employee Giving & Funded Projects

The purpose of Medical Center Health System Foundation (MCHSF) is to raise awareness and funds in support of Medical Center Health System (MCHS) equipment and projects. All donations to MCHS flow through MCHS Foundation.

Gifts to MCHSF help to purchase the most up-to-date equipment and technology, providing employees with the equipment they need to support patient care. Community donations ensure that the hospital services are here for all of us.

In fiscal year 2020, MCHSF raised nearly \$78,000 in pledges during the employee giving campaign. During this year, MCHSF purchased three bladder scanners, a new camera for the SANE (Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner) program, funded 94 percent of the Meducation program, purchased three Metaneb devices, and support for 70 campers for Stroke Support, for a total of \$70,000 given back to the health system. The remaining funds will be used to set up funds benefiting employees.

Through the time employees spend with patients and the things they do every day; they create champions for our hospital!

In 2020, Panda Express raised more than \$82,000 for Children's Miracle Network at MCHS through their in-store campaign alone. Additionally, they donated 26,000 surgical masks for our staff during COVID-19 and an additional \$30,000 for COVID-19 relief. In August 2020, Panda Cares, the philanthropic arm of Panda Express, entered into an agreement with MCHS to raise \$770,000 by March 31, 2030 for the Children's Miracle Network in order to name the Pediatric playroom the "Panda Cares Center of Hope." The Center of Hope inspires hope and promotes healing by providing specially curated services that address each child's entire well-being, including their mental, emotional, physical, and spiritual needs.

There are five reasons why I support MCHS Foundation.

In April 2007, our eight-day-old great granddaughter was rushed to MCH because of an illness. To this day, whenever I'm in a hospital and hear "Code Blue" that phrase transports me back to the scene of our family being gathered into a waiting room to be told that our great grand daughter is the Code Blue and arrangements are underway to transport her to Cook's Children's Hospital in Ft. Worth.

In July 2008, my husband's horse, Rosie, reared up and fell with him against the barn wall, pinning my husband underneath. Rosie pawed my husband's left ear as they both struggled to get up, shattering the hearing aid inside my husband's ear. After the MCH ER doctor removed the hearing aid, my husband fainted as he left the ER. The overnight stay for observation turned into three days at MCH as doctors ran numerous tests to determine why his heartbeat was irregular. Once it was determined that he had an enlarged aortic valve and an aneurysm on his aorta, arrangements were made to transport him to an aorta specialist in Houston.

In February 2017, my husband and I were finishing a landscaping project at our house. We were setting boulders as a base for a statue. One of the two boulders slipped, catching my left hand between the two. The MCH ER doc was successful in attaching the end of the finger into place, but the distal joint of my left ring finger had to be amputated when it didn't heal.

In July 2019, the MCH ER doc determined that my husband's chest pains were not from a heart attack but caused by an infection in the pleura around his left lung. After months of antibiotics, my husband can breathe normally, again.

In May 2021, our grandson was airlifted to MCH ER after being involved in a vehicle accident near McCamey. His left arm was shattered in the collision.

Today, the great granddaughter is an active and healthy teenager. My husband is active and healthy. My grandson is healing from his accident. And this explanation as to why I support Medical Center Health System Foundation is typed with a slightly shorter left ring finger.

MCH is vital to all of us. Based on my experience, you will never know when nor why you will need this excellent hospital. I believe investing in MCH is investing in your family's health.
